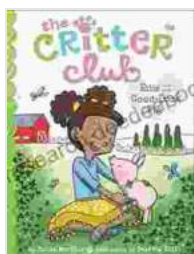

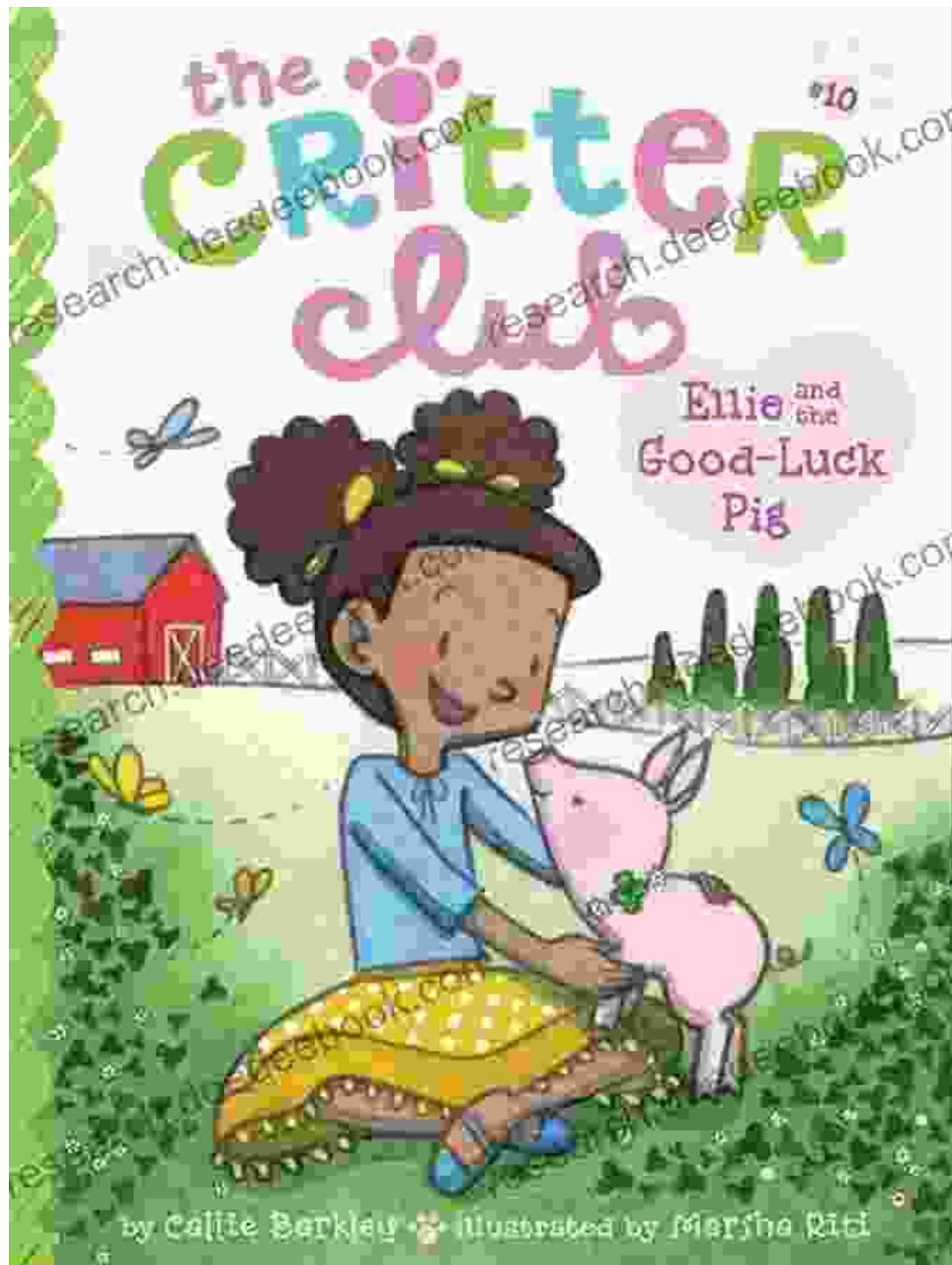

"Percy's right," Ellie said. "It's not right to bully others. We should all be kind to each other."

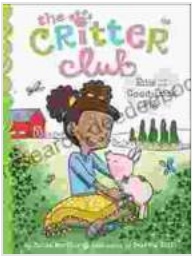

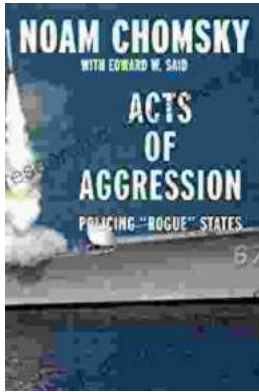
