

democratic West Berlin. Escapees from East Berlin often attempted to cross the heavily guarded border, which included minefields.




Kim Jong-II escaping through the Korean DMZ



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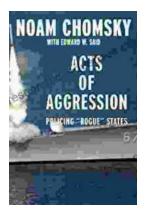
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
