
Slippery When Wet: The Ford Brothers' Risky Road to Rock and Roll Stardom



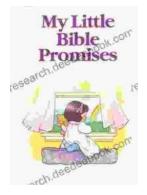

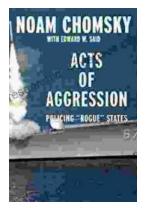
