


That Time I Went Crazy and Handwrote 580 Letters to My Facebook Friends

If you're thinking about writing a handwritten letter to someone, I encourage you to do it. It's a great way to show someone how much you care.




Here are a few tips for writing handwritten letters:

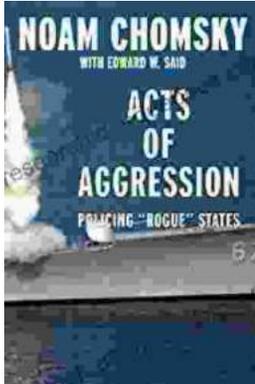
